The frontier has offered abundance to those who would take advantage of its opportunities, stimulated technological innovation, and been the source of continuous change in social structure and economic organization. Migration has been responsible for relocating cultures from the Old World to the New, and various sections of geographic territories have adjusted to the overall American culture without losing their individual distinctiveness. Federalism has shaped the United States' political and social organization. *The Metropolitan Frontier and American Politics* was begun in the late 1950s under the auspices of the University of Illinois Institute of Government and Public Affairs as a study of the eight lesser metropolitan areas in Illinois.
