Paratheticy

A Description within the dialogue. Use when you need to make sure your intention is clear.



JULY
Where's the box with the... the thing...my grandfather's...

MAC
Oh... the Voodoo box.

JULY
(Angry)
It's NOT Voodoo.



NAME (O.S) = The character is present in the scene, but is OFF SCREEN. (including phone calls).

NAME (V.O) = The character is NOT present in the scene, but the audience hears the dialog - Voice Over.

July's phone beeps. July pulls her phone out of her pocket.

ON JULY'S PHONE → Action Line

Where are you?! → Dialogue Line

BACK TO JULY.

Fuck!

Mac looks at July as she storms out of the room, leaving a mess behind.
