Some quadratic expressions are known as "perfect squares" because they can be factored into the form $(x + a)^2$.

$$x^2 + 4x + 4 = (x + 2)^2$$

$$x^2 + 10x + 25 = (x + 5)^2$$

$$x^2 - 20x + 100 = (x - 10)^2$$


What do you notice about the following expressions: $x^2 + 12x + 36$
