Trust in Theological Education Eve Parker, 2022-05-31 As those coming forward for ministerial training change and diversify is the way we learn theology changing too Integrity within our training institutions has often been assumed and granted to white male or those from the middle or upper classes This has come at the expense of the faith truths beliefs and perspectives offered by women people of colour indigenous theologies and the working classes whose testimonies have often been ignored or marginalised by the dominant discourses that have been deemed more trustworthy as a consequence of the way in which imperialism has enabled knowledge and religion to be constructed and controlled Yet theological education also has a potential to challenge these norms It holds the potential to challenge oppressive cultures theologies and pedagogies Relying on feminist black indigent and postcolonial theologies Trust in Theological Education will deconstruct dominant models of
