Scientific Classification and Names The scientific name of the White Tree Frog is *Litoria caerulea* This name has an interesting origin when the species was first described the specimen had a bluish hue due to the preservation methods used which led to the species name *caerulea* Latin for blue In the wild however the frogs are usually green or blue green not true blue The taxonomy of the White Tree Frog is as follows Kingdom Animalia Phylum Chordata Class Amphibia Order Anura Family Pelodyadidae Genus *Litoria* Species *Litoria caerulea* Previously this species was classified under the family Hylidae but advances in phylogenetic studies have since moved it to the family Pelodyadidae which includes most Australasian tree frogs The common names vary slightly depending on region and context White s Tree Frog Named after the British naturalist John White who first described the species in 1790 Australian Green Tree Frog A regional name highlighting its native habitat and coloration Dumpy Tree Frog A pet trade nickname referring to its portly build Green Tree Frog A generic term that may apply to other species so it s important to confirm scientific names when purchasing or researching care information
