Simile	Comparison using "like" or "as."	"As brave as a lion."
Personification	Giving human traits to non-human things.	"The wind whispered through the trees."
Hyperbole	Extreme exaggeration.	"I'm so hungry I could eat a horse."
Imagery	Descriptive language that appeals to the senses.	"The crisp, sweet scent of autumn air."
Symbolism	Symbols representing ideas or qualities.	"A chain symbolizes unity."
Alliteration	Repetition of initial consonant sounds.	"She sells seashells by the seashore."
Assonance	Repetition of vowel sounds.	"The early bird catches the worm."
