Virtue ethics is a moral philosophy that emphasizes individuals' character and personality traits instead of their actions.

EXPLANATION

Virtue ethics holds that an individual's ethical behavior should be measured by their trait-based characteristics such as honesty, courage, and wisdom, rather than by the consequences of their actions or the particular duties they are obliged to obey. This approach emphasizes cultivating good virtues.

CENTRAL CONCEPTS

1. **Virtue (aretê)** - Refers to genuine moral excellence of character.
2. **Eudaimonia** - humans should act in ways that seek purpose and meaning.
3. **Practical Wisdom (phronêsis)** - refers to the importance of rational decision-making based on empirical evidence.
