and Western art have been perceived as inherently at odds. However, the move away from this anthropomorphic aesthetic in Western art movements such as modern abstract and constructivist painting have presented the opportunity for new ways of viewing and evaluating Islamic art and architecture. In particular, it traces the effects of decoration and architectural planning on the human soul as well as the centrality of the gaze in this poetic view in Arabic *nazar* while examining its surprising similarity to modern theories of the gaze. Through this double gesture moving critically between two traditions, the author brings Islamic thought and aesthetics back into the realm of visibility, addressing the lack of recognition in comparison with other historical periods and traditions.
