Stroke Genetics Hugh S. Markus, 2003-05-01 Stroke is a major cause of death and the major cause of adult neurological disability in most of the world. Despite its importance on a population basis, research into the genetics of stroke has lagged behind that of many other disorders. However the situation is now changing. An increasing number of single gene disorders causing stroke are being described and there is growing evidence that polygenic factors are important in the risk of apparently sporadic stroke. *Stroke Genetics* provides an up to date review of the area suitable for clinicians treating stroke patients and both clinical and non clinical researchers in the field of cerebrovascular disease. The full range of monogenic stroke disorders causing cerebrovascular disease including ischaemic stroke, intracerebral haemorrhage, aneurysms and arteriovenous malformations are covered. For each clinical feature, diagnosis and genetics are described. Increasing evidence suggests that genetic factors are also important for the much more common multifactorial stroke. This evidence is reviewed along with the results of genetic studies in this area. Optimal and novel strategies for investigating multifactorial stroke including the use of intermediate phenotypes such as intima media thickness and MRI detected small vessel disease are reviewed. important clinical problem because of its large contribution to mortality The main causal and treatable risk factors for stroke include hypertension diabetes mellitus dyslipidemia and smoking In addition to these risk factors recent studies have shown the importance of genetic factors and interactions between multiple genes and environmental factors Genetic linkage analyses of families and sib pairs as well as candidate gene association studies have implicated several loci and many candidate genes in predisposition to ischemic stroke intracerebral hemorrhage or subarachnoid hemorrhage Recent genome wide association studies identified various loci and genes that confer susceptibility to ischemic stroke or intracranial aneurysm Such studies may provide insight into the function of implicated genes as well as into the role of genetic factors in the development of ischemic stroke intracerebral hemorrhage or subarachnoid hemorrhage
