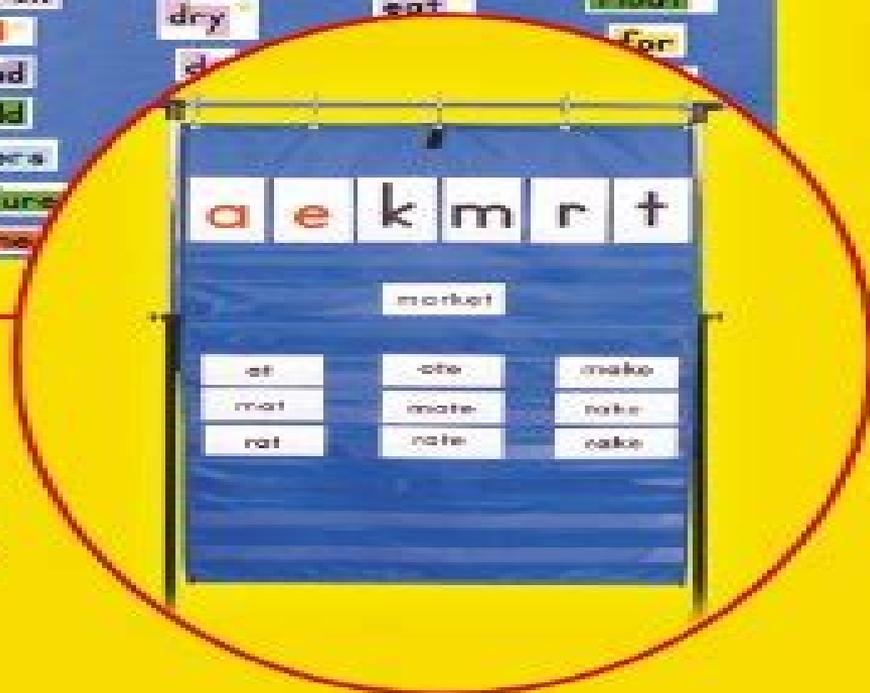

The Impact of Systematic Sequential Phonics on Second Graders Written and Oral Sight Words Amanda Farber,2007 Many of the students who enter second grade continue to have difficulties with short and long vowel relationships and struggle with spelling high frequency words correctly I implemented Systematic Sequential Phonics They Use a systematic synthetic phonics program with 21 of my second graders over an eight week period during the fall trimester of the 2007 2008 school year The purpose of this study was to answer the question will the use of Systematic Sequential Phonics They Use increase students phonemic awareness phonics understandings written high frequency words and hight frequency word vocabularies Assessment was administered in three parts pretests treatment implementation and post tests I began gathering baseline data on students at the beginning of the school year The three tests that were administered for students baseline data include the Linn Mar Community School District second grade high frequency word list Libels nonsense word fluency and Primary Spelling Inventory from Words Their Way Systematic Sequential Phonics is a multi sensory approach that provides students with hands on activities to reaching laying a strong foundation to acquiring basic phonemic awareness skills Results showed that over an eight week period students showed gains in their overall phonological awareness and high scores on their high frequency word tests
