

FIRST STEPS TO TEACHING A TODDLER TO READ

1

Read to your child every day!

Have fun, and make it an enjoyable routine, and one your child will look forward to each day.

2

Ask them "what happens next?"

Add to your daily game and ask your toddler what happens next in the story. This draws them into a greater understanding of the story.

3

Point out letters/say their names.

This helps your child build letter recognition which is one of the first steps in reading.

4

Label everything with words.

Your child will begin to recognize the letters that make up the word for the items labelled around the house.
