## The Successful Way



Teach phonics  
Children need to learn the sounds of each letter of the alphabet.

Sound and blend each letter for CVC words.



Teach word families so that children can read quickly by combining the onset and rime.

Sight words and high frequency words are taught after children have mastered sounding and blending.



Digraphs, blends and long vowels  
Digraphs are single sounds for two letter combinations while blends retain their sounds. Long vowel sounds are the same as its name.

Teach spelling patterns.  
Includes vowel combinations and irregular vowels.
